President's Report: Josh reported how well everything went. He said there was a lot of work that had to be done and he thanked everyone that showed up to work.

Committee Reports: Auction: Chris Gatschet reported that everything went very well. Shipping and cutting and wrapping also went very well. No problems.

Payout of exhibitors: Chris reported that the checks would be going out very soon. 102 buyers still have to pay. Scholarships: Currently working on them. Ag teachers must notify Chris if they want their student's checks held so they can pick them up.

Facilities: Kevin said it was a lot of work and that he will need some laborers to assist him next year. He also said that there was a lot of garbage left behind.

Parking: Jim said that the parking went very well. He will have to enforce the parking next year.

Operations: Kari said that everything went very smooth except it was just too much in one day especially for the sheep. The swine need a smaller showing and for safety the dairy and beef need a bigger showing.

Marketing: Kathleen, Jr. President, talked about how well everything went for their group. The Snack Shack went over very well. Josh said that the plan for next year is that they will be inside in the old snack room by the sheep ring. Molly said they have 30 kids small T-shirts left. Molly also said that they

were short one buckle and one chair. The chickens showed differently than she had planned. Molly would like to do a carcass workshop in January.

AgFest dates for next year will be June 12th thru 18th, 2022.

Farm to Fork: Marlene reported that next year she will include a check sheet in the application so the kids can make sure they have included everything that is required.

Offices will be elected at the August meeting. Chris Gatschet has volunteered to step up and run for Vice President.

The beer and wine booth grossed \$12,000 and netted \$8,400 and was split with the Ripon Boosters each getting \$4,200.

Diana brought up that the 4-H Representatives will apply for that position just as the Barn Chairs do. Chris and Dorothy will help Diana draw up the application. There are 3 representatives and 1 alternate. FFA selects their own.

Diana also asked if the CWA was sent a thank you note thanking them for serving donuts every morning. Molly replied she had taken care of it.

Having no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:02 p.m.
